

Carbapenemase-Producing Organisms (CPO) Guidelines for Known CPO Patient in the Outpatient Setting

- 1. Book appointment for the end of the day, if possible.
- 2. If patient is unable to attend at the end of the day, the room must not be used for another patient until it is cleaned and disinfected.
- 3. The clerk will ask the patient if he/she has a cough and if "yes" will give the patient a surgical mask.
- 4. The clerk will inform the RN that the patient is CPO positive.
- 5. The patient will be placed in a single room on Contact Precautions (and Droplet Precautions if coughing) as soon as possible.
- 6. All staff entering the room must wear isolation gown and gloves (and surgical mask with face shield/eye protection if the patient is coughing).
- 7. All equipment used must be cleaned and disinfected using accelerated hydrogen peroxide wipes by person responsible (i.e. RN, EVS).
- 8. Computer screen and/or monitor display in the room must be cleaned and disinfected using alcohol wipes by person responsible (i.e. RN, technician).
- 9. Hand Hygiene must be done by staff every time they enter and leave the patient's room.
