SHARED BATHING FACILITIES CLEANING & DISINFECTION FOR CLINCIAL STAFF

Cleaning & disinfection is a two-step process:

- 1. **CLEAN** use friction to remove any foreign matter
- 2. DISINFECT use new wipe(s) with enough liquid to leave surface wet for 1 minute followed by air drying

EVS: Clean and disinfect daily and after isolation patient Clinical Staff: Clean and disinfect between non-isolation patients/residents **Before bathing:** ☐ DO NOT share personal care items between patients

- o Label personal items (e.g., shampoo, lotion, soap, razor) with patient name and store in their room. Bring into shower room only as needed to bathe. Discard on discharge or send home with patient. OR Decant enough product from multiuse bottle for single patient into a medication cup. Store multiuse bottles in clean area protected from
- contamination. Label with date opened and discard after 28 days. ☐ Discard any unlabelled or empty personal care items left unattended

	Return labelled personal care items to patient room, discard empty or unlabelled personal care items		
	Use shower head to rinse excess soap residue down the drain		
	Use a clean towel to remove excess water		
	Place any remaining towels/linens in soiled linen hamper		
	Use Accel Intervention wipes to clean, then disinfect (in order):		
	 Shower head & hose 		
	 Shower leaver/faucet handle 		
	 Towel bar & grab bars 		
	Tub (if used)*		
	 Shower bench or bath chair 		
	Use ready to use AHP liquid Cleaner Disinfectant and long handled brush to clean,

then disinfect:

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Schedule for end of day whenever possible
Place isolation precaution sign on door to tub/shower room
Request EVS cleaning & disinfection
EVS to remove isolation sign when cleaning & disinfection complete

□ Place green means clean sticker on shower or bath chair

*Note: these guidelines refer to basic, non-jetted, household-style tubs used for shower bathing. Soaker tubs (e.g., used in maternity) and hydrotherapy tubs require specific cleaning & disinfection procedures as per manufacturer direction, refer to your site procedure for cleaning & disinfection.
