

Stretcher Cleaning and Disinfection Procedure



We need to ensure that stretchers are cleaned & disinfected between patients (high-touch points, including mattress & handrails), and returned to their designated areas.

There should be no "dirty" stretchers left in hallways or corridors.

The correct process for cleaning & disinfecting a stretcher is as follows:

- 1. Strip the stretcher of linen as soon as it is no longer in use.
- 2. Using Accel INTERvention wipes (i.e. accelerated hydrogen peroxide (AHP) 0.5%:
 - i. Take a wipe(s), and using friction (i.e. rub and scrub motion), clean the mattress, side rails and push handles to remove any foreign matter (e.g. blood and body fluids, soil or dust)
 - ii. Take another wipe(s), and using friction (i.e. rub and scrub motion), disinfect the mattress, handles and rails.
 - iii. The disinfectant product needs to remain wet for one minute following disinfection to work. This is called 'wet contact' or 'dwell time'.
 - iv. Disinfection is always followed by air-drying.

There are Accel INTERvention wipes available on all the Units, the main lobby and by the morgue. Please close container caps to ensure product doesn't dry out.
