
Your A Moments for Hand Hygiene





1	BEFORE initial patient / patient environment contact	WHEN? WHY?	 Clean your hands when entering: before touching patient or before touching any object or furniture in the patient's environment or before putting on gloves. To protect the patient/patient environment from harmful germs carried on your hands.
2	BEFORE aseptic procedure	WHEN? WHY?	Clean your hands immediately before any aseptic procedure. To protect the patient against harmful germs, including the patient's own germs, entering his or her body.
3	AFTER body fluid exposure risk	WHEN? WHY?	Clean your hands immediately after an exposure risk to body fluids. To protect yourself and the health care environment from harmful germs.
4	AFTER patient / patient environment contact	WHEN?	Clean your hands when leaving: • after touching patient or • after touching any object or furniture in the patient's environment or • after removing gloves. To protoct yourself and the health care environment from harmful corres
		WHY?	To protect yourself and the health care environment from harmful germs.
